

Stay Safe & Warm in your home!

The Stay Safe & Warm campaign was launched in November 2008, to help residents struggling to afford to heat their homes, particularly during the colder months.

Cleveland Fire Brigade works with a number of partners to:

- raise the awareness of dangers faced by people who struggle to keep warm
- highlight the support and help available to them

Who is eligible?

There is no criteria other than you or someone you know is at risk of the effects of cold, either long or short term.

For instance, if a boiler breaks down and parts are on order or when a heating system has been condemned and the resident is unable to pay for replacement or repairs.

Some people simply cannot afford to have the heating on or their existing heating supply is inadequate and fails to heat their property.

Our recipients range from 16 years old to 94.
