Better Health Better Wealth: Music in Hospitals

Music in Hospitals has proven a popular event throughout 2018 and will be continued next year; a musical event for those living with Dementia and their carers, it has improved the lives of those attending remarkably. Read on to hear how this event has changed the life of service user George, as told by his wife, Denise:

Case Study

George

"George was diagnosed with dementia with Lewy bodies in 2014 which includes Parkinsons movement disorder.

Gradually we were unable to do any of the social activities we had done together for many years and were beginning to get isolated. It was a hard decision to look for something that we could still do together and tried one or two groups. Some groups the carers sat outside the room but at the Wednesday social group myself and another carer went into the room with our partners. George could still join in a bit at that time and enjoyed it but it was a life saver for me as a carer.

I found it very hard to make that first move to go to the group but we were welcomed and soon settled in and made friends.

We do quizzes, games, and music and it can be noisy with a lot of friendly banter.

More recently George has been admitted to hospital and then to a care home.

Asking if I could still go to the social group I was overwhelmed by the response by Gillian and other members. I was told that I was a member of the group and had to continue attending.

I do attend every week and I look forward to it. A bit of a laugh and joke and the continuing

support from people who know exactly what it means to be a sufferer or carer for a person with dementia.

The help and support I have had and am still getting has been amazing. My only regret is that we did not find the group sooner.

Lately more dementia sufferers have attended with their carers and it works very well. It is a very happy group long may it continue."



Better Health Better Wealth: Yarm Coffee Mornings



Karen Heath the Care Coordinator of Yarm Medical Practice organises the coffee mornings and Age UK Teesside go along to support and is a drop in service that offers advice and information on a variety of Health and Wellbeing Services across the region.

We celebrated Christmas and a year of coffee mornings this December, with some lovely homemade Christmas cake and iced ginger cake, all cooked by Karen Heath.

The coffee mornings are held Bi-monthly at the Yarm Medical practice for residents 65 plus. There have been 55 attendances to the group since December 2017.

Throughout the year we have supported and signposted visitors to Benefit Advice services, Dementia services, OT services and legal advice services to name a few.

apple hat

intermediate pattern by Juliet Bernard

Yarn: Green and brown DK with some red and black for embroidery

Needles: 4mm

Hat

Cast on 31 sts in green

Beginning with a knit row continue in st st for 14 rows

Next row: k2tog to last st, k1 (16sts)

Next row: purl

Next row: k2tog to end (8sts)

Change to brown

Next row: p2tog 4 times then work an icord for 6 rows.

Next row: K2tog twice. (2sts) Next row: k2tog and fasten off

Leaf

CO 3 st in green

Row 1: kfb k1 kfb (5sts)

Row 2: purl

Row 3: k2 m1, k1, m1, k2 (7sts)

Row 4: purl

Row 5: knit

Row 6: purl

Row 7: k1, ssk, k1, k2tog, k1 (5sts)

Row 8: purl

Row 9: ssk, k1, k2tog (3sts)

Making up

Use a sewing needle to join side seams and sew in the ends. Attach the leaf to the stalk. Embroider eyes and mouth in black and apple cheeks in red.

Middlesbrough Befriending Service



"Following lots of hard work, networking, presentations and promoting the service, we are now starting to see a number of volunteers being matched and introduced to older lonely people in the community and there is a real sense of 'making a difference' and helping individuals to make changes in their lives. Older people are referring themselves for support and we are dealing with more volunteer enquiries.

This month we have seen a number of individuals being introduced to a volunteer Befriender and the initial effect is positive and up-lifting with both parties benefiting.

In the New Year we will be working with Middlesbrough Library Services and delivering 'roadshows' across the area in the local Hubs. The roadshows will provide people with an opportunity to pop into their local Hubs and meet members of staff, have a cuppa, find out what Age UK Teesside may be able to offer them and, if appropriate, refer into the Befriending Service.

Carole is one of our volunteers. She has been with us for 6 months now and thoroughly enjoys the time she spends with her lady Edith. Edith has been with us since the beginning of the project. Having built a relationship with her previous befriender Julie, she was really disappointed when Julie left our programme and was understandably apprehensive about being introduced to a new volunteer but with a lot of gentle persuasion she is now pleased with her new friend, Carole. When I first introduced them they 'hit it off' immediately and found a lot of common ground.

Carole (right) tells us a little bit about their friendship:

"Although only having known Edith for a few weeks, her shining personality, sense of humour and mischievous ways are quite endearing and captivating.

Having spent most of her working life in 'retail' some of her stories are enough to make your hair curl. Edith set her sights on what she wanted out of life and always achieved her goals.

Having worked in a 'store' many years ago where Health &

Safety were not an issue back then; Edith bent over to pull something out of the freezer while the lid was propped open with a sweeping brush; Edith knocked the brush and the freezer lid crashed down on her nose. Turning up for work the next day she was a sight to behold with two lovely black eyes but carried on without a care in the world, telling the boss "it was his fault".

The best story she tells me was when she worked in Binns Department store as a 'receptionist' but took it upon herself to cut a ladies hair (because the hairdresser was on her lunch break). The client was elated with her lovely haircut, however the boss was not too impressed when he caught her in the act. Edith could normally talk her way out of anything she tells me, but not this time she was straight out of the door!!

Not one to let the grass grow under her feet Edith decided to take a job in a factory which involved working with 'small electrical parts'. Management required 'right handed staff', Edith is left handed but told them she could use either hand, she couldn't!!

Edith reminds me of a naught schoolgirl and at the ripe old age of 90 hasn't changed a bit and I hope she doesn't!! Go girl – rock on Edith!!

Redcar Befriending Service

On November 26th 2018 Robynne and Amanda of the Redcar befriending team, completed their Dementia Friends Champions Training. It is something that they both have been very passionate about doing for a while now.

"A dementia friends champion is a volunteer who encourages others to make a positive difference to people with dementia in their community. They do this by giving the information about the personal impact of dementia and what they can do to help." ~Dementia Friends, 2018

In the new year, Robynne and Amanda will be delivering Dementia Friends information sessions to newly recruited Age UK Teesside Befriending Volunteers, as well as working with existing volunteers to help support them in their role to ensure that the people we visit with dementia are living well.

"We are both really excited to start spreading the knowledge and information we have learnt to ensure that Redcar and Cleveland is a dementia friendly borough."

Silver Surfers

Silver Surfers at Marske Library has been a huge success. We have a core group of regulars that come every week and have come on so far! From not knowing how to connect to the internet to now becoming fully fledged 'Silver Surfers'. They have learnt to write an email, send a text and even how to take a 'selfie' and post to social media for their families abroad to see. It has been wonderful to see how far they have come. They are now able to share what they have learnt with one another and it has become a safe environment for them to learn, and sometimes fail. Many of our attendee's were scared of 'breaking' their smart phones or even the internet but as our Silver Surfer's Volunteer Roger assured them, "You wont break the internet. Many have tried and failed already. So don't worry".

We encourage people to write down steps in a simple way, to draw and copy what the key icons look like and to go away during the week and practice. We also tell attendee's if they have any questions throughout the week to do with their devices, write them down and we will go through them at the next session. This seems to really help!

In 2019 we are looking to work with Redcar and Cleveland council to expand Silver Surfers across other libraries in the borough. We are looking for Volunteers with basic ICT skills who can spare 2 and a half hours a week. If you or anyone you know might be interested then please get in touch.

The last Silver Surfers session was on **Friday 14th December 2018, 10.30am - 12pm**. We will back in the new year on **Friday 11th January 2019, 10.30am-12pm**.






