About the Role

As a Blue Badge Application Support Volunteer, you will visit clients in their own homes and support them to complete their Blue Badge application online. Where appropriate, you may complete the online application on the client's behalf, with their consent and using the information they provide, or guide and support them to complete it themselves.

What You'll Be Doing

- Visiting clients in their own homes at an agreed time.
- Explaining the application process clearly and reassuringly.
- Supporting the client to complete their Blue Badge application online, either by completing it on their behalf with their consent or helping them to complete it themselves.
- Checking the application is complete before it is submitted.
- Explaining what the client can expect after their application has been submitted.
- Maintaining confidentiality, data protection and appropriate professional boundaries at all times.
