

Ambition for Ageing – One year on



Its been an incredible first year for the project. We have mapped assets in our allocated wards of Atherton, Leigh West and Pemberton, invested in projects for and run by people over 50 and recruited lots of volunteers for Local Investment Panels, Forums and Community Ambassadors. We are starting to see that small changes can make a big difference with dedicated volunteers, a little money and lots of enthusiasm.

One of the 38 investments made to date by the Ambition for Ageing Project includes mobile equipment for the Classic Cinema Club (Part of Leigh Film Society).

The group were awarded £1,945.59 by the Ambition for Ageing Local Investment Panel.

Elizabeth Costello, volunteer organiser of the group, said "This investment has enabled us to purchase a number of items including promotional material and mobile equipment. In addition to the growing numbers of attendees at our club we are now starting another in Tyldesley. The Classic Cinema club is held on the last Friday of every month at the Turnpike Centre in Leigh with the film starting at 1pm and refreshments available from 12.30pm. The new Classic Cinema Club is held at the Pelican Centre in Tyldesley on the last Monday of each

month at 1pm. Our venues are accessible and we welcome new members. It's a great place to relax and enjoy a film from days gone by amongst friends." The group were recently fea-





tured on Granada Reports.

The Ambition for Ageing project has also successfully made 2 larger investments to date (up to £10,000). The first is for innovative equipment for the MS Support Group in Marsh Green, Pemberton and the second to set up a new community garden at the Greengrass Centre in Atherton.

And our Customer Survey Said...

We monitor the services that we provide and ask the people using them to tell us what they think. Here is what they have said:

- 100.0% say that staff treated them with courtesy;
- 99.8% say that our staff were reliable;
- 96.8% say that the service was helpful to them
- 98.5% would use the service again;
- 98.5% would recommend us to their friends and family.

In addition, 70.6% describe us as 'excellent' and 26.9% as 'very good', with only 1.7% as 'average' and 0.4% as 'poor'.

We also monitor the longer term impact on the lives of older people using our services. As a result of being in contact with us:

- 9.4% feel less lonely as a result of using our services;
- 36.1% feel more positive;
- 71.4% know where to find information they need;
- 44.9% feel safer at home; and
- 37.7% find it easier to manage around the house.

These figures are based on feedback from older people using our services over the period January to December 2016 *.

We are pleased with this strong endorsement of the services that we provide and always strive to improve what we do.

* Based on 476 returns to our Quality Monitoring Questionnaires in this period across all our services. 799 questionnaires have been sent, representing a response rate of 47.7%.


