
# Age UK Wigan Borough urges older people to review their Energy Tariff!

Thoughts of energy consumption and the need to keep your home warm may seem a distant requirement in the middle of summer, but Age UK Wigan Borough is urging local older people to plan ahead for winter by reviewing their energy tariff and shopping around for a better energy deal. A recent report from the Competition and Markets Authority (CMA) found that millions of energy customers have been 'paying too much for their energy bills.' Furthermore, around 70 per cent of customers are currently on their energy provider's 'default', and generally more expensive, standard variable tariff, despite having the option to switch to a new provider or fixed-rate tariff, which could save them money.

Roy Naylor, Commercial Manager at Age UK Wigan Borough, said, "We urge older people in Wigan Borough to take a look at their energy tariff and switch to a better deal if they can. We encourage those in later life to consider switching to a fixed tariff, so their energy bills are locked in for a longer term. Switching and fixing now will mean your new tariff is up and running before autumn when, inevitably, colder weather will set in."

Age UK Wigan Borough believes it is important for all older people to be able to keep their energy usage and bills as low as possible. There are many things that can be done to help achieve this, but an important factor is to ensure older people are on the best tariff for their needs. It is therefore important to shop around and consider all the options – in the current environment switching to a fixed rate tariff can provide peace of mind and help manage energy costs for the long-term.

The **Age UK Fixed 2 Year tariff** is a tailor-made gas and electricity package exclusively for people aged 60 and over (or aged 50-59 if on the Priority Services Register), brought and supplied to you by E.ON.

#### Outreach

Harry Unsworth is now well underway with his traverse

Wigan Borough across the Borough to spread the word about Age UK Wigan Borough and the excellent services we provide. In order to do this he has built a database of clubs/ organisations that provide activities for the 50's and has visited 17 groups to date including a regular monthly outreach session at a local pharmacy in Hindley. The database of groups and clubs will soon be made available to all staff so that if you get any enquiries from clients about activities in their area you will be able to accommodate them. Just a few permission issues that have to be worked out before we can publish the database. So watch this space.

Harry is also arranging a number of, 'Come and meet us,' events in the Autumn the first of which will be at the Astley Heritage Tea rooms 15<sup>th</sup> Sept. More dates and venues to follow. #### Engagement: Impact Forum for over 50's

Great progress is being made with the formation of the new Impact Forum, Wigan Borough, supported and coordinated by Age UK Wigan Borough. We held our first public interest meeting on July 30<sup>th</sup> in advance of the official launch on October 13<sup>th.</sup> We have new leaflets to distribute and forum membership forms for interested parties to complete.

Through regular local forum meetings to be held bi-monthly in Wigan, Leigh and Ashton, people over the age of 50 will now have the opportunity to make sure they can make their thoughts and opinions known to the main service providers within the Borough on a broad range of issues including:

#### Health and Social Care Housing Transport Safety and the Environment

Consultation engagement work has already taken place. In May this year we were approached by Wigan Borough CCG for help with two different pieces of work where they needed to consult directly with older people in the Borough. We were able to introduce the CCG to a number of our clients & members who were happy to share their thoughts and experiences around their recent health care in the Borough, both on video and in an informal discussion/workgroup setting.
