# What have we been up to?


### **Annual General Meeting**

We are relieved that the triple lock is now secure so pension payments are guaranteed to keep pace with inflation.

### **Support at Home**

Our paid for Home Help and Handyperson services assist people to live solely and independently in their homes. We specialise in everyday tasks and small practical jobs.

### **Handyperson**

Our Handyperson team were in festive spirits putting up Christmas Decorations making it easier for people to enjoy the Christmas period. They also made fabulous decorations out of re-cycled wood. This was a creative way to raise funds to support our charity.





# **Home Help**

Our fantastic Home Helpers have been working hard to make it easier for people to live in their own homes comfortably. Louise, a Home Helper visits a gentleman 3 times a week cleaning and shopping and offering general support. Over the past 2 years Louise has developed a relationship with her

customer resulting in chats about everyday topics.

He recently bought a mobility scooter but due to lack of confidence he was reluctant go out on his own therefore Louise suggested he goes on his scooter and Louise will walk/run beside him on his first trip out.

#### **Information & Advice**

Our free service provides information and advice on a wide range of topics such as pension credit and attendance allowance or practical guidance like filling out applications for a blue badge.

### **Information and Advice Impact**

Our demand for our Information and Advice has significantly risen due to the cost of living crisis. A recent survey shows that 74% of our information and advice customers would not know where to go if our services where not available. Since April 2022 we have helped households claim in total over £2 million that would have otherwise been unclaimed benefits. A service user says "My husband would not have applied for attendance allowance and received it. I have now been able to apply for discount on our council tax and carer's allowance. Very positive impact of your service – thank you."
