Being an outdoor event has given us huge advantages as it meant we could work with the Covid restrictions and keep meeting (apart from a couple of months on Zoom). The second Wednesday of each month at 10.00am finds a bunch of friendly and enthusiastic KYP volunteers with their equally friendly and enthusiastic dogs, outside the Bowls Pavilion in West Bank Park. After the meeting and

greeting, the dogs take us on a walk through the woods, much enjoyed by dog walkers, dogs and invited guests. Our guests are people who are experiencing social isolation in one form or another. They really appreciate the relaxed and non-judgemental vibe offered, plus the sheer joy of spending time in the company of dogs. We'd love to see a few more guests if you know anyone who might benefit. Volunteers at the Bowls Pavilion provide hot drinks and a covered veranda where we chat afterwards. The Dog Café now has its own committee to ensure that this unique event continues and can reach more people.
