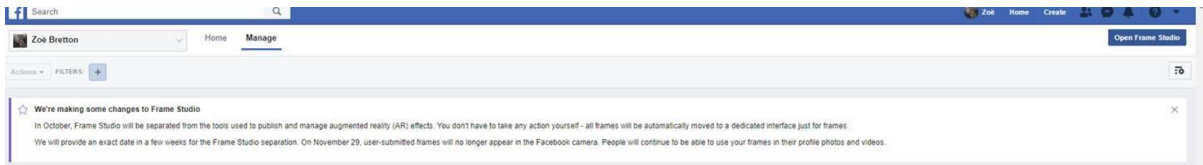
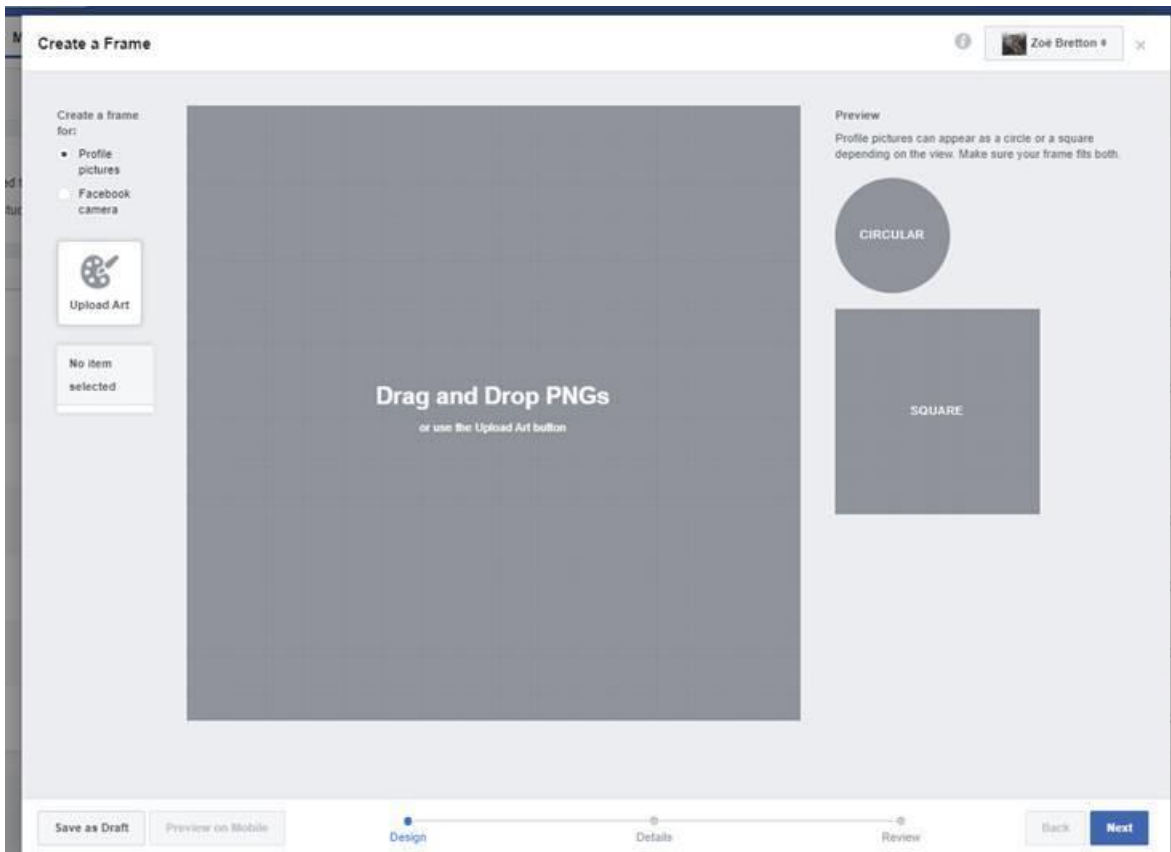


Uploading a Facebook Profile Frame

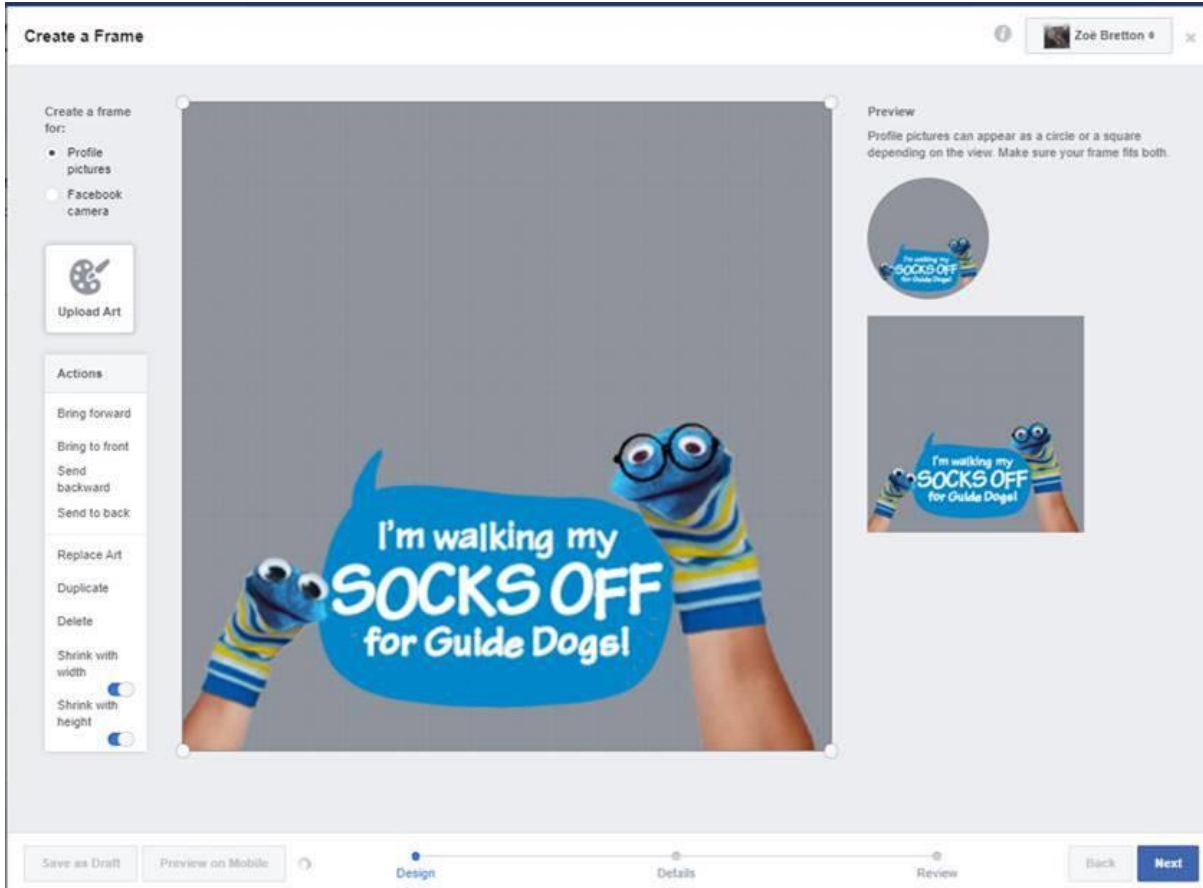
1. Go to this page = <https://www.facebook.com/frames>
2. Make sure you're logged in as admin on the correct Facebook account
3. Click "open frame studio" in the top right



4. Choose either "Profile Pictures" or "Facebook Camera" in the top left - Profile Picture will be for somebody to overlay the image on their current profile picture. Facebook Camera allows somebody to take a new profile picture directly with the image overlay. The Profile Picture option is most used, but you could do both



5. Drag and drop the PNG image in. You can resize and move it around as required. You can add in multiple PNG files if required



6. To test how it appears in situ, click "Preview on mobile" in the bottom left. This will send a notification to your mobile, so please make sure you're logged into the same account on a mobile device to test the positioning of the frame
7. When you're happy with it press next, and you'll go through to the stage below

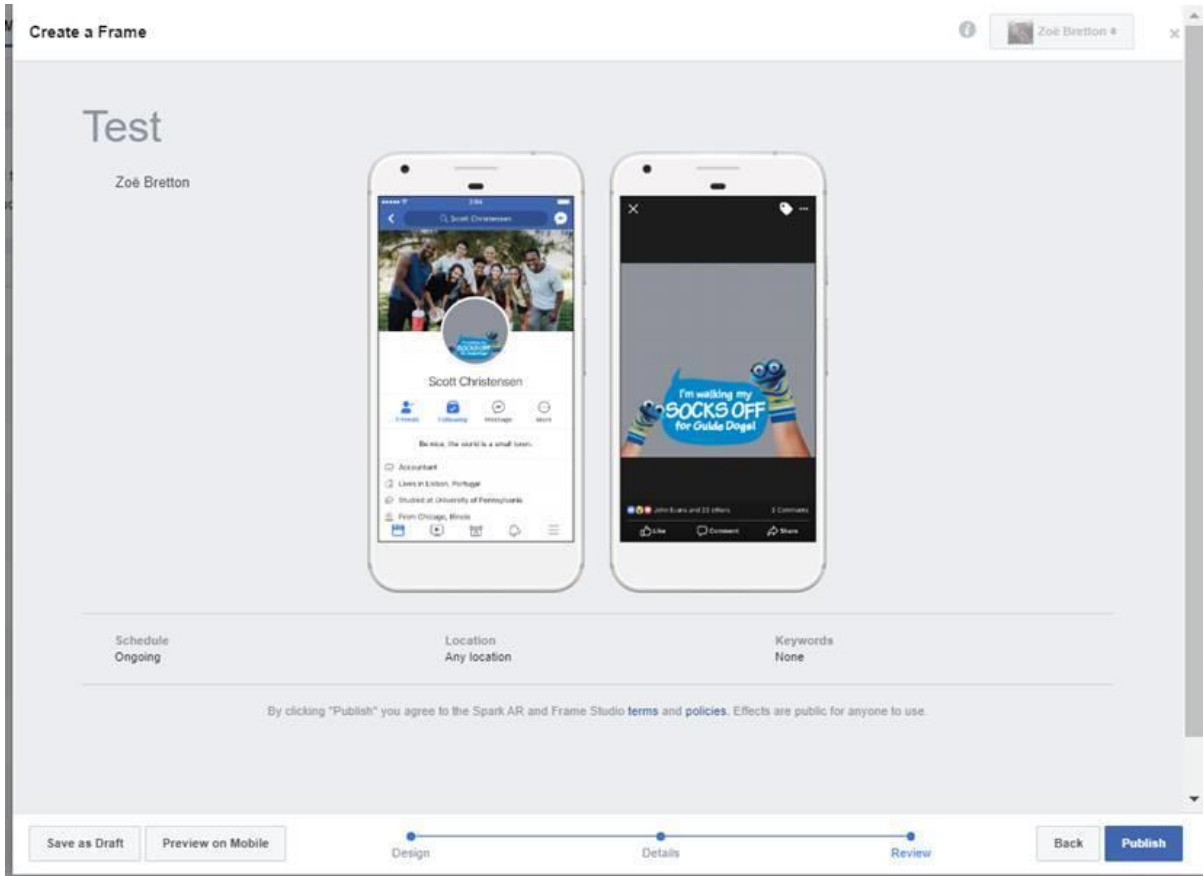

8. Here you will name the frame, choose where it is available location wise, schedule if you only want it available during certain dates (note you can simply make the frame inactive at any time, if you don't want to choose an end date at this stage) and add in keywords for people to be able to find the frame (note that you can also supply people with a link for the frame, so keywords aren't 100% needed)
9. Click next and you'll be taken to the screen below




10. Here you can see the frames in situ again by going to "Preview on mobile". You can also save as a draft, go back if you're not happy with anything or publish if you're ready to use the frame
11. When you publish you will see your frame appear in your Frame Studio. It will show as "active" and either "under review" or "approved" (please note sometimes they are approved immediately and sometimes take up to 24 hours)
12. For the purposes of these instructions I have turned the frame to "inactive" (by pressing the toggle)


